About the Show:

Improvising with energy and color, *Ad-Lib* will feature an instinctively culled collection of work from a wide swath of AMcE’s artist and program roster. Works, including paintings, works on paper, photographs, and prints, will be grouped into a non-thematic collection.

The show will also feature a few impromptu installation alterations, including the reconfiguration or introduction of new artwork during its run. The entire pool of work will be available online through individual digital artist catalogues.

Aspects of *Ad-Lib* are unconventional for the gallery, and as the title suggests, it will just go with the flow and think outside the white cube.
